unior Auxiliary of Jonesboro's 12 service projects, which make a difference in the lives of an estimated 5,000 children in Craighead County each year, are completely funded by the nonprofit organization's annual Charity Ball. The glamorous event, now in its 53rd year, promises to deliver attendees and patrons a night that is Out of This World.

Ashley Snider, the 2024 Charity Ball chair, is currently serving in her sixth year with Junior Auxiliary of Jonesboro (JA). The Jonesboro native graduated from Nettleton School District before earning a degree in early childhood education at Arkansas State University and pursuing a career in education - first as a kindergarten teacher in St. Louis, then as a first-grade teacher at Jonesboro School District's Visual and Performing Arts Magnet

School. She worked at VPA for several years after she and her husband, Andy, moved back to their hometown in 2017 to open Snider Performance + Spine.

"It was the perfect fit for me," said Snider of her time at VPA. "My love for teaching children to read blossomed there, and I finished up my master's and specialist (degrees) to do just that. As the clinic grew, so did our family. We welcomed our son, Beckett, and my role shifted to focusing on staying home with him and helping at SPS as we adjusted to this new way of life and navigated COVID with the rest of the world. ... Susannah joined our family in the beginning of 2023 and has been my right-hand girl for all of the volunteer work that comes with being a member of Junior Auxiliary.

Snider has served on the Kickstart Kindergarten, Literacy & More, Scholarship and Growing Healthy projects, and she has volunteered with Community Outreach Programs (COPs), The Learning Center (TLC), Girls Enrichment Junior and Senior High and Consolidated Youth Services (CYS) during her six years as a JA member. In addition to those projects, JA also funds and volunteers for Share & Wear, Crown Club and Molly the Megabody.

"Kickstart Kindergarten will always hold a special place in my heart; magical things are happening down those kindergarten halls," she said. "Growing Healthy was such an exciting project and possibly my favorite. It was hands on; I was getting to see so many of my former students, and the energy was always so high. It's hard to beat the excitement of inflating pig lungs with a bicycle pump."

The 2023-24 JA President, Haley Thomas, has also served in a variety of roles during her five years with the nonprofit organization. Thomas and her husband, Keith, have two sons, Townes and Whitman, and giving back to the community is something the family prioritizes.

"I appreciate the opportunity to be a part of Junior Auxiliary because it aligns with my passion for making a positive impact in the community, especially in addressing the needs of children," said Thomas, a University of Arkansas graduate who serves as the director of clinical operations for Families Inc. "The organization's focus on identifying and meeting the needs of the children in Craighead County resonates with my values, and I am eager to contribute to that mission. I was drawn to this organization because it is recognized as a great and impactful organization. Its history of bringing about positive change and making a difference in the lives of individuals is impressive. Being part of such an organization allows me to be part of a collective effort towards creating meaningful change.
